Commemorating the New-martyr Zachariah of Mora

Sunday, January 20, 2019

Apolytikion of the Resurrection (Tone 1)

While the stone was sealed by the Jews, and the soldiers were guarding Thy most pure body, Thou didst arise on the third day, O Savior, granting life to the world. For which cause the heavenly powers cried aloud unto Thee, O giver of life. Glory to Thy Resurrection, O Christ, glory to Thy kingdom, glory to Thy providence, O Thou Who alone art the lover of mankind.

Apolytikion of St. Euthymios (Tone 4)

Be glad, O barren one that hast not given birth; be of good cheer, thou that hast not travailed; for a man of desires hath multiplied thy children of the Spirit, having planted in them piety and reared them in continence to the perfection of the virtues. By his prayers, O Christ God, make our lives peaceful.

Apolytikion of our Patron the Archangel Michael (Tone 4)

O ye foremost of the heavenly hosts we beseech thee, though we are unworthy, pray that we may be encompassed with a shadow of Thy unearthly glory, preserving us who kneel and cry endlessly: deliver us from oppression since ye are the prince of the Highest Power.

Kontakion of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple (Tone 1)

Thou, O Christ God, Who by Thy Birth, didst sanctify the Virgin's womb, and, as is meet, didst bless Simeon's arms, and didst also come to save us; preserve Thy fold in wars, and confirm them whom Thou didst love, for Thou alone art the Lover of mankind.

Daily Readings

THE EPISTLE (for St. Euthymios)

The saints shall be joyful in glory Sing to the Lord a new song.

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians (4:6-15)

Brethren, it is the God Who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," Who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ. But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, to show that the transcendent power belongs to God and not to us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies. While we live we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you. Since we have the same spirit of faith as he had who wrote, "I believed, and so I spoke," we too believe, and so we speak, knowing that He Who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into His presence. For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

THE GOSPEL (for the Twelfth Sunday of Luke)

The Reading of the Holy Gospel is according to St. Luke (17:12-19)

At that time, as Jesus entered a village, He was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices and said, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." When He saw them He said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went they were cleansed. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving Him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. Then Jesus said, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" And He said to him, "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well."

The Synaxarion

On January 20 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate our righteous Father Euthymios the Great of Palestine.

Verses

With this life, O Euthymios, what hast thou in common? Depart to those strangers to this life, that is, the Angels. On the twentieth noble Euthymios ceased from life.

Euthymios was born in the Armenian town of Melitene near the Euphrates River. He was the only child born in answer to the prayer of his barren parents Paul and Dionisiya. Finally, they had a vision and heard a voice saying, "Be of good cheer! God will grant you a son, who will bring joy to the churches." The name Euthymios means "good cheer." From his youth, he lived a life of asceticism, eventually settling in the Pharan Desert between Jerusalem and Jericho. He filled his days and nights with prayer, internal thoughts about God, contemplation and physical exertion. Around him many disciples gathered, some of whom are glorious saints such as Sabas the Sanctified. God gifted Euthymios to expel demons, heal the gravely ill, bring water to the desert, multiply bread and prophesy. When some of the younger monks wanted to fast more than others, he forbade them and commanded them to come to the communal table so they would not become prideful. He also taught monks not to move from place to place: "A tree frequently transplanted does not bear fruit. Whoever desires to do good can do it from the place where he sits." Euthymios reposed peacefully at age 97 in 473.

On this day, we also commemorate the New-martyr Zachariah of Morea. By their intercessions, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.

GLOSSARY: Apolytikion (ah-poh-lee-tee-key-on); plural, Apolytikia: A brief poem in accentual metre, expressing the theme of a feast. Kontakion (kon-tah-kee-on); plural, Kontakia: A special kind of Troparion that expresses the teaching of a Feast. It summarizes and applies the meaning of a feast of day. Orthros (Or-thros): The word literally means early morning. It is the name of the service, which by some has been called Matins, and still by others, Lauds, though it does not correspond exactly to either of the Western Services. Eothinon (ee-oh-thee-non): meaning – pertaining to the dawn. They are the eleven assigned readings of the Gospel during the Orthros Service, pertaining to the eleven appearances of our Lord to His Disciples after the Resurrection. Synaxis (see-nax-sees) "the gathering or coming together" as it pertains to a celebration of a commemoration or feast. Following a major Feast a "Synaxis" commemorates the "costars" of the Feast, i.e., following the Feast of the Presentation of Christ (Ss. Simeon and Anna), following the Feast of the Birth of Christ (the Holy Virgin Mary), following the Feast of Holy Theophany (St. John the Baptist), etc. Synaxarion (see-nax-sah-ree-on) the summary of a Feast, describing a historical significance and meaning of a commemoration.

A Note Regarding Holy Communion

Since we understand Communion to mean that we have all things in common, sharing an identical Faith, *only* those who are members of the Orthodox Church and who have prepared themselves through prayer, fasting and recent Confession may participate in Holy Communion. (We invite all, however, to partake of the blessed bread which is distributed at the dismissal.) Please see the Pastor for inquiries on how to become a member.

في ذلكَ الزَّمانِ، فيما يسوعُ داخِلُ إلى قَرْيَةٍ، اسْتَقْبَلَهُ عَشْرَةُ رِجالٍ بُرْصٍ وَوَقَفُوا مِنْ بَعيدٍ* وَرَفَعُوا أَصْواتَهُمْ قَائِلِينَ: يا يسوعُ المُعَلِّمُ، ارحَمْنا. فَلَمّا رَاَهُمْ، قَالَ لَهُمْ: امْضُوا وَارُوا الكَهَنَةُ أَنْفُسَكُم. وفيما هُمْ مُنْطَلِقونَ طَهُرُوا * وإنَّ واحداً مِنْهُم، لَّا رأى أنَّهُ قَدْ بَرِئَ، رَجَعَ يُمَجِّدُ اللهَ بِصَوْتٍ عَظيمٍ * وَخَرَّ على وَجْهِهِ عِنْدَ قَدَمَيْهِ شَاكِراً لَهُ، وكانَ سامِرِيّا * فَأَجابَ يسوعُ وقالَ: وَلَيْسَ الْعَشْرَةُ قَدْ طَهُرُوا ؟ فَأَيْنَ التَّسْعَةُ؟ * أَلَمْ يوجَدْ مَنْ يرْجِعَ لِيُمَجِّدَ اللهَ إلاّ هذا الأَجْنَبِي؟ * وَقَالَ: قُمْ وامْض، إيمانُكَ قَدْ خَلَّصَك.

ملاحظة بخصوص تناول القربان المقدس

إن مفهومنا لتناول القربان يعنى عمومية المشاركة فيه لذوى العقيدة الواحدة، الا إن المشاركة في سر القربان المقدس هنا مقتصر فقط على أعضاء الكنائس الارثوذكسية والذين يحضرون أنفسهم بالصلاة والصوم والاعتراف منذ فترة قريبة (وعلى كل حال، فإننا ندعو الجميع للمشاركة في الخبز المقدس الذي يوزع عند إنتهاء مراسيم القداس.) رجاء مراجعة الكاهن إذا رغبت أن تصبح عضوا في الكنيسة الارثوذكسية
