Apolytikion for the Resurrection (Tone 3)

Let the heavens rejoice and the earth be glad, for the Lord hath done a mighty act with His own arm. He hath trampled down death by death, and become the first-born from the dead. He hath delivered us from the depths of Hades, granting the world the Great Mercy.

Apolytikion for Saints Zenobius and Zenobia (Tone 4)

Thy Martyrs, O Lord, in their courageous contest for Thee received as the prize the crowns of incorruption and life from Thee, our immortal God. For, since they possessed Thy strength, they cast down the tyrants and wholly destroyed the demons' strengthless presumption. O Christ God, by their prayers, save our souls, since Thou art merciful.

Apolytikion for our Patron, Michael the Archangel (Tone 2)

Daily Readings

THE EPISTLE (for the Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost)

The Reading from the Second Epistle of St. Paul to the Galatians (1:11-19)

Brethren, I would have you know that the Gospel which was preached by me is not man's gospel. For I did not receive it from man, nor was I taught it, but it came through a revelation of Jesus Christ. For you have heard of my former life in Judaism, how I persecuted the Church of God violently and tried to destroy it; and I advanced in Judaism beyond many of my own age among my people; so extremely zealous was I for the traditions of my fathers. But when He Who had set me apart before I was born, and had called me through His grace, was pleased to reveal His Son to me, in order that I might preach Him among the Gentiles, I did not confer with flesh and blood, nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were Apostles before me, but I went away into Arabia; and again I returned to Damascus. Then after three years I went up to Jerusalem to visit Cephas, and remained with him fifteen days. But I saw none of the other Apostles except James the Lord's brother.

THE GOSPEL (for the Fifth Sunday of Luke)

The Reading of the Holy Gospel is according to St. Luke (16:19-31)

The Lord said, "There was a rich man, who was clothed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, full of sores, who desired to be fed with what fell from the rich man's table; moreover the dogs came and licked his sores. The poor man died and was carried by the angels to Abraham's bosom. The rich man also died and was buried; and in Hades, being in torment, he lifted up his eyes, and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus in his bosom. And he called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy upon me, and send Lazarus to dip the end of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in anguish in this flame.' But Abraham said, 'Son, remember that you in your lifetime received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in anguish. And besides all this, between us and you a great chasm has been fixed, in order that those who would pass from here to you may not be able, and none may cross from there to us.' And he said,

Then I beg you, father, to send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they also come into this place of torment.' But Abraham said, 'They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them.' And he said, 'No, father Abraham; but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' He said to him, 'If they do not hear Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced if someone should rise from the dead."

The Synaxarion

On October 30 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the holy Martyrs Zenobius and his sister Zenobia in Cilicia.

Verses

The stout-hearted Zenobia, though a woman, with thee, O Zenobius, the sword endureth. On the thirtieth Zenobia and brother were beheaded.

Inflamed with zeal for the Faith, these two, with great love, gave away their riches to the poor. Because they were so open-handed, God shielded them from all evil by men or demons. The generous and merciful hands of Bishop Zenobius were endowed by God with the gift of wonderworking, so that Zenobius was able to heal the sick. At a time of persecution, the judge Licius seized him and threatened to kill him if he did not offer worship to idols. Holy Zenobius replied: "Life without Christ is not life, but death; and death for Christ's sake is not death, but life." When Zenobius was put to harsh torture, his sister, Zenobia, presented herself before the judge and said: "I also want to drink this cup of suffering and be crowned with that wreath." They were both beheaded with the sword in about 285, and thus brother and sister entered into the immortal Kingdom of Christ the King.

On this day, we also commemorate the Apostles Cleopas and Artemas of the Seventy; and Venerable Joseph and Kyriakos, patriarchs of Constantinople. By their intercessions, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.

Building Funds Capital Funds Campaign

As 2022 is coming to an end and we anticipate worshipping in our new church sanctuary in a relatively short time, we must consider the continued financial support needed to complete our Building Project.

We pray that the City of Los Angeles will issue a TEMPORARY Certificate of Occupancy in the near future, however to secure a PERMANENT Certificate of Occupancy we will be required to fund additional capital expenditures on the exterior of our property to obtain it.

Our project is divided in two parts: Phase 1 and Phase 2. Phase 1 is the actual church building and includes the exterior property improvements required by the City of Los Angeles Building Department. The exterior property improvement requirements include: a) a new Vanowen Street base wall and fence, electric gate, landscaping (currently underway), b) parking lot repairs, including slurry sealing, stripping, c) disabled persons and low emission vehicle signs; d) a trash shed enclosure must also be erected, with water and power provided to the structure. St. Michael Church will also be required to complete: e) electrical vehicle parking space connections and f) a bicycle rack.

One of the very large expenses on our plans, that the City has allowed us to temporarily postpone, is g) a covered parking with solar panels.

Phase 2 of the Project includes the interior Byzantine church iconography and furniture that many of you have witnessed in the course of construction. The fourth installation of iconography is scheduled to begin at the end of this month. The work has been overseen by our Pastor, the V. Rev. Timothy Baclig.

We need everyone's continued financial support of Phase I of the Project since we have fallen short in funding the external requirements.

As you consider your possible tax liability to the IRS for 2022, we ask that you consider making a donation to the St. Michael Church Building Fund which can be a substantial tax deduction for you. It truly is a winwin situation for you and St. Michael. Please consider a financial contribution according to your situation, with a cheerful heart.

PASTORAL SERMON The Fifth Sunday of Luke By V. Rev. Timothy Baclig October 30, 2022

The lesson of the Fifth Sunday of Luke is among the lessons that introduce us to the season of Advent, preparing us for the Feast which celebrates the birth of our Lord. It focuses our attention upon the practice of good deeds reminding us of God's love and personal sacrifice by sending His Son into the world.

In our time there is a great deal of attention being given to the subject of wealth and poverty. St. John Chrysostom spoke at length on the subject. His writing is available in English, published by St. Vladimir's Press, entitled: On Wealth and Poverty.

People whose lives are either shaped by wealth or poverty manifest certain attitudes and behavior. Those attitudes and behavior can also be evident among those whose lives move from poverty to wealth and from wealth to poverty. Very often whether or not someone worked to earn his or her wealth, or simply inherited wealth is very telling. For Christian believers, the main virtue in the case of both – and something that is the true test of one's sincerity is humility. Humility as a virtue is the foundation Christian love. It is the basis of a "good confession" and the true motive of love. Its opposite is: arrogance, selfishness, greed and hatred – all of which we are warned about by our Tradition, beginning with Christ, the Apostles, and the Holy Father's. That warning comes with pointing to consequences.

We also hear in the Gospel our Lord's own warning: "To whom much has been given – much will be required." Money will not buy you everything. Sadly, there are many who are misguided in thinking otherwise.

The parable of *The Rich Man and Lazarus* of today's Gospel lesson is in two parts: 1) the life of the rich man and Lazarus on earth, and 2) their life after death.

The two are contrasted to make the following points: First that there is an eternal perspective to life. That eternal perspective gives us a sobriety with an

understanding that in this life there is a spiritual quality from virtuous choices that are acquired whether a person is wealthy or in poverty

In commenting on the parable St. Gregory the Great speaks of the affects of poverty and riches to the rich man and Lazarus: *The fire of poverty cleansed Lazarus of his evil deeds*, and the happiness of this passing life rewarded the good deeds of the rich man. Poverty afflicted [Lazarus] and wiped him clean; wealth rewarded the [rich man] and deprived him of everything else.

In a commentary by St. Ambrose we hear: Lazarus was a pauper [one of extreme poverty and lived by charity] in this world, but [was] a rich man before God. . . Yet not all poverty is holy nor is wealth sinful, but as excess dishonors riches, so sanctity commends poverty.

One's eternal destiny, therefore, is something that begins in this life, and our stewardship of material things. Having an abundance of material things or to live in poverty has a direct affect on our spiritual life. The message at the beginning of Great Lent is very similar: What doth it profit a man if he were to gain the whole world and loose his own soul? Just as we were reminded before the Great Lent that insofar as we are merciful to others, so will our Father in heaven be merciful to us; and that doing good to the needy is the same as having done a good deed to the Lord. Therefore, at the start of the Fast of the coming season that includes for us a time of the year when we are commemorate our nation's many blessings at Thanksgiving, we are again reminded that merciful kindness, Christian charity, and love are among the spiritual virtues that save us from needless agony and eternal torment.

Prayer

O Lord, our God of love and great mercies, we thank Thee for your goodness in providing for all of our needs. Purify our hearts and minds from all forms of selfishness, neglect, and arrogance. Grant us the vision to see and to understand the meaning of your Gospel message as we gather about your table and anticipate dining in your heavenly kingdom.
